Chapter Vision Statement


To offer women the opportunity to network and grow personally and professionally through mentoring, education and team support.

Core Values for the American Business Women's Association


- 1. **Selfless Leadership** Be committed to doing the right thing, always. Be transparent in your actions even when no one is looking!

2023 VIRTUAL REGIONAL CONFERENCE

The 2023 Virtual Regional conference was held on March 10 & 11. Friday's keynote was Debra Fine speaking on Cultivating connections Via Virtual Meetings, Email, Text and Phone. There were tips on how to start conversations and make business connections. Our Friday professional development session was with Randy Dean with tips on using Outlook and Gmail to get organized and save time. In the afternoon, our speaker was Elizabeth Hambleton and Standout Social Media Graphics in Canva. We learned the basics of Canva and how to create different graphic media.

Saturday's Keynote was Brenda Peyser on The No Club: Putting a stop to Women's Dead-End Work. Women always seem to say yes to the small tasks that the company needs to have done but men say no. They're the small, non-promotable tasks that take up time up during the day which results in women doing the real work at home. Some tips were to say no, but suggest an alternative person or department to do the project. Our professional development speaker was Dr Meggie Mapes with Communicate to Innovate: Integrating Strategies for Intergenerational Collaboration. As always it is good to learn ways to effectively work/collaborate with the different generations.

The Stephen Bufton Memorial Educational Fund National Scholarships for the 2023-2024 Award Year were announced. The \$2,000 scholarship submitted by Greater Oakland Charter Chapter was approved and also announced. This scholarship will be awarded in Spring 2024.
